Led by therapists and volunteers—many with specialized training through AccesSurf—the clinic focused on water safety, mobility and confidence. This milestone expands access to adaptive sports while equipping families with tools to support wellness at home.





# AIMING FORWARD:

## Jeannine Hippchen-Pereira's Journey of Resilience and Renewal

Walk through the Ala Wai park and you might spot Jeannine Hippchen-Pereira with a bow and arrow in hand, taking an archery class or perhaps you'll find her laughing over a game of Mahjong with new friends. For Jeannine, staying active and engaged is not just a way to pass the time—it is a testament to her incredible tenacity and her determination to keep moving forward.

### A Sudden Loss and the Road to REHAB

In early 2025, an unexpected tragedy changed Jeannine's world forever. A severe car accident, caused by a sudden medical emergency, resulted in the heartbreaking loss of her partner of 13 years, Jerry. The crash also left Jeannine with severe injuries including two broken vertebrae.

Coupled with a previous injury that had left her with broken arms just months prior, Jeannine found herself starting over—deeply grieving and stripped of her physical independence. Knowing she needed the highest level of care and support to rebuild her life, she chose to recover at REHAB Hospital of the Pacific, embarking on a comprehensive rehabilitation journey that would span both inpatient and outpatient care.

### Healing Through Art and Hard Work

At REHAB, Jeannine's journey wasn't just about physical rehabilitation; it was about finding peace amidst profound grief. She fully committed to intensive physical therapy, strengthening her balance and mobility. A pivotal moment in her emotional healing came when she joined REHAB's art classes.

Having not picked up a paintbrush since the seventh grade, Jeannine began painting ocean sunsets—a touching tribute to the times she and Jerry used to sit in Waikiki watching the waves. The painting sessions became a deeply cathartic outlet. Through her art, she was able to process her grief and visually document her journey.

### Embracing a New Chapter

Today, Jeannine refuses to sit still and let life pass her by.

*"At some point, you realize you have to make a choice," Jeannine reflects. "You can let the heavy weight of grief keep you frozen, or you can take a step forward. Moving forward doesn't mean forgetting the past; it's about finding the courage to rebuild and discovering that you still have a beautiful life left to live."*

For her, the desire to embrace the future is a conscious, daily choice that highlights her enduring strength. Transitioning from a patient and back to an active community member, she continuously pushes herself to step out of her comfort zone. She joined a gym to build her walking stamina, and she fills her week with Mahjong, archery classes and dinners with friends—including a former REHAB roommate she bonded with during her stay.

Jeannine is living proof that even after unimaginable loss, life can still be filled with new passions, strong community connections and the unyielding resilience to keep aiming forward.

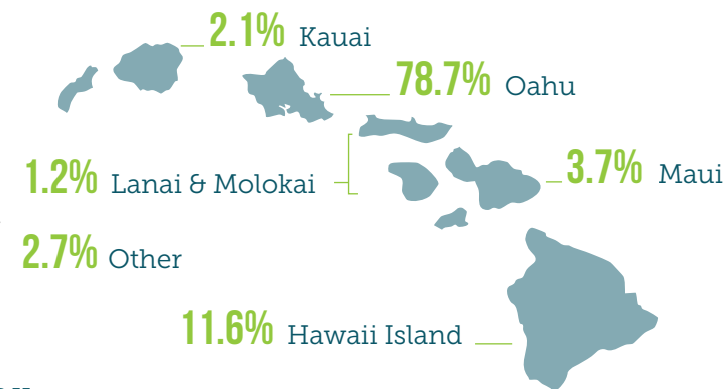

By training future clinicians in a specialized care environment, REHAB is strengthening career pathways while building a more resilient healthcare system for Hawaii’s future.

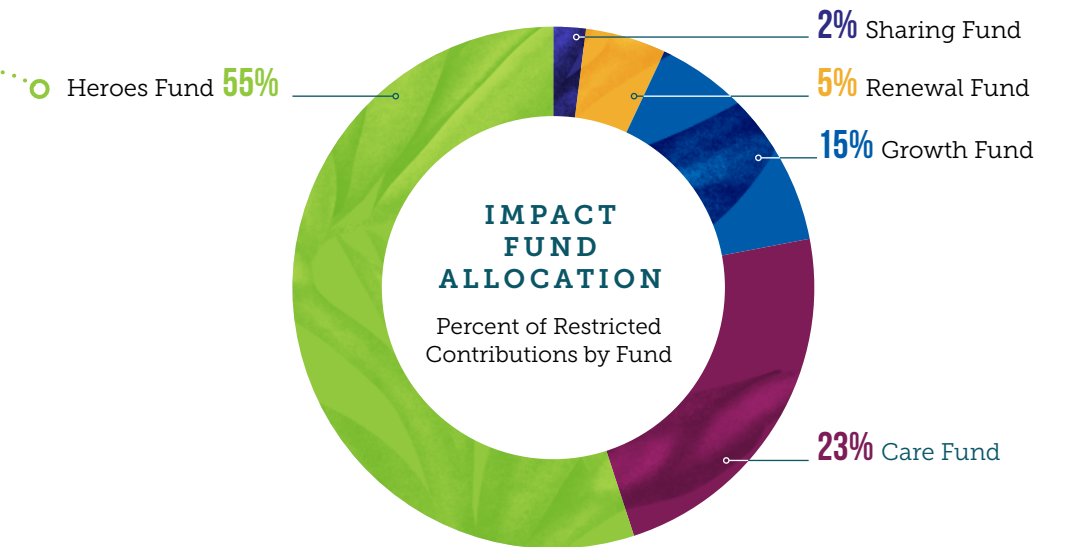

## Signature Events Advancing Rehabilitation in Hawaii

Throughout the year, REHAB Hospital of the Pacific's signature events bring together patients, families, caregivers and community partners in support of one shared purpose: **advancing rehabilitation in Hawaii.**

These gatherings reflect a simple truth—**recovery is strengthened through connection.** Beyond fundraising, they sustain the continuum of care that helps patients regain independence and return to the lives and communities they love.

## 30TH ANNUAL REHAB GOLF CHALLENGE

The **30th Annual REHAB Golf Challenge**, sponsored by **First Hawaiian Bank** brought together golfers, sponsors, volunteers and supporters on May 28, 2025, at the Hawaii Prince Golf Club. Together, participants raised more than \$200,000 in support of programs at the REHAB Hospital of the Pacific, directly advancing patient care and recovery across Hawaii.

Beyond the fairways, the event reflected the heart of rehabilitation—connection, hope and resilience. Emcee William “Billy V” Van Osdol, a cancer survivor and former participant in REHAB’s iCARE Cancer Rehabilitation Study, shared his personal journey, offering a powerful reminder of what rehabilitation can make possible.

This year, First Hawaiian Bank generously initiated a \$30,000 matching campaign in honor of the tournament's 30th anniversary, doubling the impact of each contribution to the hospital.
